Wonderful Christmas Eve Services

Advent welcomed the Christ Child with four festive Christmas Eve worship services on December 24th. The 3:00 & 6:00 p.m. services featured musicians from our new contemporary worship service. The 8:30 & 11:00 p.m. services featured traditional organ and other instruments. All four services included carols, candlelight and communion and were preceded by 30 minutes of pre-service music featuring numerous Advent disciples sharing their incredible gifts including woodwinds, harp, cello, flute, guitar, piano, hand bells and voice. Thank you to everyone who shared their gifts with us during the Advent and Christmas seasons.

Longest Night Service

President's Corner

As Lutherans we actively celebrate Epiphany. Epiphany is the season of the church year that begins on January 6th and ends on Ash Wednesday. January 6th is the date, according to church tradition, when the Magi paid homage to the baby Jesus. Therefore, up until Ash Wednesday on February 10th we will celebrate Epiphany over 4 Sundays through Bible readings that teach us about the early ministry of Jesus.

On the first Sunday after the Epiphany we will read about the Baptism of Jesus. On the Second Sunday after Epiphany we will learn that Jesus performed his first miracle at the wedding in Cana where he turned water into wine. The third Sunday after Epiphany describes Jesus in his hometown of Nazareth where he reads a passage from Isaiah and declares that he has fulfilled those prophetic words. The fourth Sunday describes the reaction from his hometown residents about that declaration of prophetic fulfillment.

Leaving a Legacy or How do you want to be remembered?

"My church family". How many times have we heard that statement, or made it ourselves? For many of us, our church family is an extension of our own. Many get involved in their church family by serving; serving on the council, teaching Sunday school, or singing in the choir, for example. Many families who move into new communities, get involved in a church right away, and become part of its family. How often does that love and commitment translate into a living legacy?

Annual stewardship is a focus here at Advent. But what about after life stewardship? Many members might include Advent, and other ministries of the church, in their estate plans if they only knew the possibilities. As we include the congregation as a vital part of our family during our life, so too should we include it in our estate plans. After all, you can't take it with you!

Advent has an endowment program where one can 'Leave a Legacy'. It is called the **Advent Endowment for Ministry.** It is an enduring gifts fund of Advent Lutheran Church. Members and friends of Advent may wish to give lasting support to Advent's mission and ministry through its endowment. These charitable gifts may be in the form of bequests, memorials, honorariums, and special gifts as follows:

- Bequests of specific dollar amounts
- Bequests of a percentage of the estate
- Primary or successor beneficiary designation on a life insurance policy
- Remainder interest in a charitable life income trust or a revocable living trust
- Remainder interest on a retirement plan or IRA and Keogh accounts
- "Payable on death" designation on a savings account or certificates of deposit
- Transfers of property (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and real estate)

The donor should designate ADVENT ENDOWMENT FOR MINISTRY as the beneficiary of their gifts. Donors are urged to contact any member of the endowment committee, or the Pastor Jerry, when preparing papers to make such a gift.
