President's Corner

During the months of May, the church celebrates the feast days of three of the apostles: James the Lesser and Philip on May 3; Mathias on May 14. What does the Bible tell us about these three men? First, James was called the lesser or the younger to distinguish him from James, the son of Zebedee. He was also known as James, son of Alpheus. He is mentioned many times in the Book of Acts as the leader of the church in Jerusalem. He is credited with writing the epistle of James. He died in 62 A.D. after being thrown from the temple and then beaten to death by people with clubs or mallets. This behavior toward James was instigated by Herod Agrippa, King of Judea. Since they used mallets and pestles, James is the patron saint of blacksmiths and pharmacists.

Philip's story is found mainly in John's gospel and in chapter 8 of Acts. In Chapter 1 of John, Jesus calls Philip and Philip in turn brings Nathaniel to Jesus. Philip is at the feeding of the 5,000 in John 6 and is reproved by Jesus in John 14:8 for asking Jesus to "show us the Father." In Acts his encounter with and subsequent conversion of an Ethiopian is a remarkable story of faith in action. According to church history Philip evangelized in Greece and then he travelled to Hierapolis in Phrygia (modern Turkey) to establish a church there. In 80 A.D. he was crucified upside down by order of the pro-console in revenge for converting the proconsole's wife to Christianity. Philip is the patron saint of hatters and pastry chefs.
